This responsibility includes: designing, implementing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error, selecting and appropriate accounting policies and making accounting estimates. applying appropriate accounting policies, and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.
